
Trading Places Newsletter February 2016

Trading Places is a way for us to increase our efforts to create sustainable work and employment opportunities for people unable to manage mainstream opportunities. We have invited senior executives to work alongside our workforce as colleagues so that they go back to their companies excited at the prospect of doing something sustainable. By us getting commercial work it gives us the means to have control over our future without having to depend on funding it also helps us provide employment opportunities and on the job training for people who have been excluded from the mainstream job market due to mental health or other disadvantages.
